Storying the System – Understanding Our Local Food Network

Today You Will:

- Become a system storyteller
- Explore how food flows through your community
- Represent the role of one key food system actor
- Help build the North Minneapolis "Northstar Registry" through creative media



What is the Northstar Registry?

- A living map of food system actors in North Minneapolis
- Built with community knowledge, not just data
- Shows how gardens, food shelves, restaurants, and more work together to feed the community
- You're helping us tell these stories!

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You will:

- Research a type of food system actor (like chefs, food pantries, or gardens)
- Answer key questions based on what this actor does, needs, and offers
- 3. Create a media piece that tells the story of this actor in the food system

Final Products Can Be:

- A written story or article
- A 1-minute video
- A digital or hand-drawn infographic
- A short poem or voice memo

Guiding Questions (Use These to Research + Write)

- 1. What does this food sector node type do?
- 2. What are their biggest wins and challenges?
- 3. What do they give and receive in the food system (inputs and outputs)?
- 4. Who do they work with? How?
- 5. How could they benefit from being on the SankofaPOWER map?



Research & Synthesize (30–40 min)

Do This:

- Read the example questions provided for your role
- Use Google or ask community members to fill in gaps
- Write or draw rough notes describing your assigned actor as if it were one voice

Remember: You're not describing one organization—you're telling the story of a whole group type.

Create Your Artifact (30–45 min)

Pick one of the following:

- A 1-minute video or TikTok-style explainer
- An illustrated info card or flyer
- A short article (150–250 words)
- A rap, poem, or spoken word piece

Use any tools available—phones, Canva, paper, Flip, or even CapCut.



Connect to SankofaPOWER

Ask Yourself:

- How could your actor type use the SankofaPOWER food map?
- Could it:
 - Show harvest updates?
 - Promote donations or sales?
 - Recruit volunteers?
 - Share cultural food stories?

Add this reflection to your project or include it as a final slide.

Share and Reflect

- Present your artifact to your class
- Give feedback to your peers: What did you learn about other parts of the system?
- Reflect together: How are all these actors connected?
